RE: Resolution Related To The Proposed 415,000 s.f. Niagara Bottling Facility in Town of Ulster

Dear President Noble:

The Town of Ulster Town Board on October 16 voted to declare its "Intent to be Lead Agency for the SEQR Type I Action - Coordinated Review." The Notice of Intent was subsequently circulated to **Involved** and **Interested** Agencies.

There are FOURTEEN agencies listed as Involved:

Town of Ulster Town Board (Site Plan Approval) Zoning Board of Appeals (Variance to Reduce the number of off-street parking spaces) Ulster County Department of Health (Water) Ulster County Dept of Public Works, Highway & Bridges Division (Highway Permits) City of Kingston Water Board (Water supply) US Army Corps of Engineers (Nationwide Permit) NYS Department of Environmental Conservation, Region 3 (Sanitary/Storm Water) NYS Department of Health (Water) Town of Ulster Sewer Department Town of Ulster Water Department Town of Ulster Water Department NYS DEP NYC Department of Environmental Protection Ulster County Industrial Development Agency (IDA)

Involved Agency

An 'Involved Agency' for SEQR is involved when "the determination is made that the agency has or will have a discretionary decision to make regarding some aspect of the action."

Interested Agency

An 'Interested Agency' has about as much authority as the public. To be listed as an interested agency, as defined in 617.2 (c) to mean 'a state or local agency.' Any private organizations, interest group and/or individual have the ability to participate in the SEQR process.

The Conservation Advisory Council performed a critical function in hosting an event that drew a capacity crowd of concerned residents, collected over 250 questions, and highlighted numerous, compelling impacts that require wider expertise than the Town of Ulster can provide as Lead Agency. The NYSDEC is better equipped to address the complex tasks that need to be performed in evaluating the Niagara proposal.

The Board of Water Commissioners does maintain a central position in deciding to sell Kingston's water outside of City limits to non-residential customers, however the Common Council has an active role in the process of bonding monies and approving projects. <u>Article XI Section C11-4 Powers</u> of the City Charter states:

"Said Board, with the assent of the Common Council, may construct and maintain waterworks for supplying said city and its inhabitants with pure and wholesome water; exercise such powers as are necessary and proper to accomplish such purpose and shall proceed in the manner hereinafter prescribed."

I urge the Common Council to draft a resolution(s) that 1) protects the interests of Kingston residents and our supply of clean drinking water; 2) memorializes and endorses the recommendation of the Kingston CAC (and for the Council's information, both <u>Riverkeeper</u> and the <u>Town of Woodstock</u>) that the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) declare itself Lead Agency in the Niagara Bottling matter; and 3) fulfills our role as elected representatives of City of Kingston residents by declaring our intent to have the City of Kingston listed as an **Involved Agency**.

Thank you for your assistance with this time-sensitive matter.
